Golf bag

Please tie with a golf tag with your name (in the Roman alphabet). Nickname is fine, however please make sure to put same name on the tag and registration card.

Dress code

Please see and check the other information.

Check in

Most golf courses require players to arrive for check-in about 45-60 minutes prior to tee time – if you are late, your reservation might be cancelled automatically, so please ensure that you are there accordingly.

On arrival at the golf course, you check in at the reception desk. You will be given a locker key and score card in a small wallet. Your locker key will be way you will be identified by the golf course, and your purchases in the shop, refreshment stands(kiosk), and restaurant etc. will be charged on your locker key number.

Tips

In Japan, there is NO Tipping custom except for few cases.

However, many of Japanese golfers give tips to the caddies when they enjoyed and satisfied with caddy's services. An average amount of tip to a caddy is 1,000yen (not per player).

Distance Notation

Although Japan is using the metric system for all other measurements, at Golf Courses, the distance is always measured in Yard.

The Public Bath

After the round is completed, most of the golfers take a hot bath. <u>Please see and check the</u> other information.

Check out

After taking Japanese bath, probably you have some drinks at the restaurant or bar. When you are ready to go, return your locker key holder to the reception desk and make a payment for green fees, shopping and restaurant charges etc.
